

Emergency generators for Ukraine

The district of Hassberge continues to help make life as easy as possible for the people in the war-torn country. The new emergency power generators have now been handed over in Poland. From there, the journey continues to the Mostyska region.

HASSFURT: The Landkreis Haßberge has donated two emergency generators for the Ukraine. The aid transport is already well arrived in the Polish partner town of Klobuck, which is close to the Polish border. With the machines the district is helping the people in the Mostyska region, to which the Polish twin town of Klobuck maintains friendly relations.

The mayor, Myroslava Pelc, had written a letter to the Polish Starosta Henryk Kiepura and asked for help to the people in war-torn Ukraine with electricity generators. The letter was then the basis for a further aid-delivery between Henryk Kiepura and Landrat Wilhelm Schneider for the Ukrainian partner municipality. The mayor had described the areas of operation and the requirements for the emergency power generators in detail. Nevertheless, not an easy task for Stephan Kolck, former head of the clinic, who was in charge of the procurement, because emergency generators are currently in high demand and are therefore a rare commodity. Two diesel generators were purchased, which were suitable for critical infrastructure facilities and are designed for continuous operation.

This donation was the perfect complement to the emergency power generators that the district Klobuck had already delivered to Ukraine in January. Mayor Myroslava Pelc expressed her gratitude on the occasion of the handover of the generators, also on behalf of the town of Mostyska thanked Starosta Henryk Kiepura and Landrat Wilhelm Schneider for the humanitarian aid from Poland and the Hassberg Mountains. The equipment will be used in the boiler house of a hospital, a fire station and two heating centres for citizens and internally displaced refugees.

Stephan Kolck and Albin Wagenhäuser from the Haßberge district office were on the made the 800-kilometre journey to Klobuck on the carnival weekend to Klobuck to hand over the donation. The duo from the Haßbergs was warmly welcomed by a Polish and Ukrainian delegation, who all expressed their great gratitude. Starosta Henryk gave an impressive account of the most recent aid transports from the Poles, which he himself had accompanied in his fire brigade uniform. "The war has now also arrived in Mostyska", the district administrator said with emotion and showed a photo of the mayor bidding farewell to young men who left for the front to Bachmut.

The group from Klobuck also went to Lwiw. Into the cathedral there, photo walls show the deceased of the parish, many of them children. "But the morale is unbroken," reports Kiepura. The school bus donated by the Haßberge district was also shown on a video, Henryk Kiepura himself had taken at the end of January. "Our help goes directly to the people," the Hassbergler are pleased. There are plans to send further aid deliveries for the Ukraine via their partners in Poland. Donations are still welcome.
